**NOAA Fisheries Announces More Than \$9 million in IRA Funds for North Atlantic Right Whale Recovery** – The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Fisheries last week announced more than \$9 million from Inflation Reduction Act funds to support strategic partnerships aimed at improving fishing gear and population monitoring that will help the recovery of North Atlantic right whales. These partnerships include collaborations with state agencies, academic institutions, non-profit organizations, and science-based groups. North Atlantic right whales are one of the most endangered species on the planet and are approaching extinction. In its announcement, NOAA Fisheries designates entanglement in fishing gear and vessel strikes as primary threats to the species, while also noting climate change is impacting every aspect of their survival.

An estimated \$6.9 million of this funding will support further development of on-demand (or "ropeless") fishing gear technology by providing funds to fishing industry partners to assess and provide feedback on technologies that prevent fishing gear entanglements, while approximately \$2.8 million will fund partner efforts to improve monitoring and modeling efforts, including long-term population monitoring. These funds are part of an \$82 million investment in North Atlantic right whale recovery efforts that NOAA Fisheries first announced in September 2023. These new partnerships build on previously announced Inflation Reduction Act funding focused on reducing the risk of vessel strikes using new technologies and approaches, including partnerships with MITRE, NASA and the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation. # **Legislative Updates**

House and Senate to Hold Informal Negotiations on FY 2025 NDAA in Mid-September – House and Senate Armed Services Committee staff plan to begin informal conference negotiations on the fiscal year 2025 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) in mid-September. Negotiators will have limited time to come to an agreement on the annual defense policy bill before the 2024 election and to ensure the bill's passage by the end of the year. In addition, negotiators will be challenged to contend with controversial House-passed provisions that are largely omitted in the

Senate committee-approved bill.

The House passed its version of the FY 2025 NDAA (H.R. 8070) on the floor by a 217-199 vote on June 14. That bill would authorize \$895.2 billion for defense programs, which aligns with the spending cap set for national security programs under the June 2023 debt-limit deal (Public Law 118-5). It also includes controversial provisions barring reimbursement of service members for abortion-related travel and eliminating any diversity, equity, and inclusion activities at the department.

In contrast, the Senate's version of the NDAA (<u>S. 4638</u>) authorizes \$923.3 billion for defense programs, exceeding the agreed upon spending cap by about \$28 billion. Although the Senate Armed Services Committee advanced its legislation on June 13 by a vote of 22-3, Senate lawmakers adjourned for the August recess without considering the legislation. It is unclear whether the Senate measure will receive floor consideration when the chamber returns in September, or if the Committee-passed bill will be negotiated against the House-passed version.

Senator Jack Reed (D-RI) Chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee said he "very much" expects the bill to come to the Senate floor in September and said that he has talked to Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY) who "understands the urgency of getting the bill done." More than 1,100 amendments have been filed to the Senate version of the NDAA, and it's important to note the Coast Guard Authorization Act (CGAA) may be among the amendments attached to the final version of the legislation.

The NAWE team will continue to monitor progress on the FY 2025 NDAA and report on any significant developments in this area.

# **Executive Branch Updates**

CBP: Customs User Fees to Be Adjusted for Inflation in Fiscal Year 2025 – U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) recently published a general notice stating that user fees and their corresponding limitations set forth in the notice for Fiscal Year 2025 are required as of October 1. On December 4, 2015, the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act, Pub. L. 114–94) was signed into law. Section 32201 of the FAST Act amended section 13031 of the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (COBRA) of 1985 (19 U.S.C. 58c) by requiring the Secretary of the Treasury to adjust certain customs COBRA user fees and corresponding limitations to reflect certain increases in inflation.
